The early 1800's saw an explosion of sewing machine patents. Finally, in 1830 a French tailor named Barthélemy Thimonnier patented the first mechanical sewing machine. Going a step beyond the other inventors, Thimonnier actually put his model into production. So, although the first sewing machines were patented many years before it wasn't until the 1850's that the sewing machine was actually used.
